



Welcome to Wuruma Dam

Thank you for visiting Wuruma Dam. SunWater encourages all visitors to help keep our dam recreational facilities a fun, safe place to relax and have a good time. Please take note of the below guidelines for your safety and enjoyment.

Read the signs, don't take risks, stay safe

For your own safety, please take note of the signs around the dam. The signs indicate hazards to watch out for and areas to avoid. Keep an eye on your children and inform them of the hazards and where they are allowed to go. Visitors are required to comply with all relevant laws whilst on SunWater property.

Recreational facilities and hours of operation

We encourage you to enjoy the boating and picnic facilities responsibly.

Camping

Camping at Wuruma Dam is permitted in the designated camping area only (refer to map overpage). The camping area is jointly administered by SunWater and the North Burnett Regional Council.

No bookings are required and all camping is free-of-charge, however stays are restricted to a maximum of two weeks. Camp sites must be at least 10 metres from the water to give ample time for relocation if water levels rise.

Please note that there is no treated water available at Wuruma Dam. Please bring your own drinking water with you.

The disposal of chemical toilet waste at Wuruma Dam amenities is prohibited. The nearest dump point is located in Eidsvold, opposite the Star Hotel.

Cutting or pruning trees and gathering firewood is prohibited.

Fishing

Fishing is not permitted within 100m upstream and 200m downstream of the Wuruma Dam wall.

A low cost fishing permit is available from Fisheries Queensland that sets out the conditions under which you can fish at Queensland dams. Call Fisheries Queensland on 13 25 23 to locate your nearest fishing permit outlet or apply online at www.smartservice.qld.gov.au/services/permits/fishing/apply

Antisocial behaviour

If you observe vandalism, antisocial behaviour or any illegal activities please contact the Police immediately on 000 so we can keep the recreational areas safe and enjoyable for all.

Pets

For everyone's enjoyment and safety, please keep your pet on a leash or restrained during your stay.

Open fires and barbeques

There are no barbeque facilities at Wuruma Dam. Visitors and campers are permitted to use their own non-wood-fired barbeques. Open fires are not allowed anywhere on SunWater property.

Help stop the spread of weeds and pests

Please keep your vehicles, trailers and boats clean to limit transfer of weeds and pests when entering and leaving this area.

Boating, skiing and other water activities

Please be aware that boating, skiing and other water activities are not permitted within 200m upstream or 400m downstream of the Wuruma Dam wall.

Commercial, club or large group activities

Commercial, club or large group activities require advance approval from SunWater. Please contact SunWater on **13 15 89** at least three weeks ahead to discuss your event and arrange for appropriate approvals.

Rubbish

Help us to keep the recreational areas clean and tidy by using the rubbish bins provided. If the rubbish bins are full please take your rubbish with you.

The disposal of Redclaw crayfish remains in the rubbish bins is not permitted. Please take Redclaw remains with you when you leave.

Wuruma Dam Facts

- Wuruma Dam is located on the Nogo River approximately 23 kms North-West of Eidsvold.
- Construction of Wuruma Dam was completed in 1968.
- Wuruma Dam provides water for farmland and townships along the Burnett River downstream of the dam for approximately 160 km.

Getting there

From Eidsvold (47 km)

From Eidsvold, head north on the Burnett Highway (A3) for 19 km, then turn left onto Wuruma Dam Road (signs for Abercorn & Wuruma Dam).

Follow Wuruma Dam Road for 29 km, passing through Abercorn, until you reach Wuruma Dam.

From Monto (60 km)

From Monto, head south on the Burnett Highway (A3) for 13 km to Mulgildie then turn right onto Hughs Street.

Follow Hughs Street for 2 km (becomes Abercorn Road), crossing Three Moon Creek, and turn left to stay on Abercorn Road.

Follow Abercorn Road for 22 km to Abercorn. At Abercorn turn right onto Wuruma Dam Road.

Follow Wuruma Dam Road for 20 km until you reach Wuruma Dam.
