



Where do you see these warning signs?






Dams, weirs and water channels

Warning signs at dams, weirs & water channels

Warning signs, such as this one at Jones Weir, help to educate and protect members of the public.



Let's take a closer look...

Do you know what the sign is telling us?



Underwater pipes could suck you in





Surface may be uneven or slippery



No swimming allowed- there may be strong currents



No access- you are not allowed in this area

Recognising the different types of signs

These signs are telling us that we are not allowed to do something. What are we not allowed to do here?



Recognising the different types of signs

These signs are warning us about a possible danger or hazard. What is the potential danger?



Deep waterdepth may vary

Unstable edgetrip or slip hazard





Danger: Weir or dam wall ahead

Submerged logslogs under the water
