

Welcome to Wuruma Dam



Thank you for visiting Wuruma Dam on the traditional lands of the Wakka Wakka people. Help keep it a safe place to relax and have a good time by following these guidelines.

Read the signs

For your safety, please take note of signs around the dam. They indicate hazards and areas to avoid. You must comply with all relevant laws on Sunwater property.

Camping

Camping is permitted in the designated camping area near the dam wall. The lakeside area near the boat ramp is for recreational day use only.

No bookings are needed and camping is free of charge. Stays are restricted to a maximum of three weeks in any four-week period.

There are no showers or treated water available at Wuruma Dam. Please bring your own drinking water.

Accessible toilets are available for visitors. A chemical toilet waste dump point is now available and another is available at nearby Eidsvold, opposite the Star Hotel. Dumping in areas other than these locations is strictly prohibited.

Fishing

Fishing is not permitted within the buoy line upstream or immediately downstream of the dam wall. You must hold a fishing permit, which is available from Fisheries Queensland. The permit sets out the conditions under which you can fish at Queensland dams. Antisocial behaviour

Please respect the recreation facilities at Wuruma Dam. If you observe vandalism, antisocial behaviour or any illegal activities please contact the police immediately on **000** and Sunwater on **13 15 89**. This helps us keep the recreational areas safe and enjoyable for all.

Pets

For everyone's enjoyment and safety, please keep your pet on a leash or restrained during your stay.

Open fires and barbeques

Gas barbeque facilities are available for your use. You may also use your own non-wood fired barbeque. Open fires are not allowed anywhere on Sunwater property.

Help stop the spread of weeds and pests

Please keep your vehicles, trailers and boats clean to limit the transfer of weeds and pests when arriving or leaving.

Boating, skiing and other water activities

There may be hazards under the water's surface that are not easily visible, so be careful and always obey the signage.

It is the responsibility of each visitor to be aware of the risks at the dam and when operating a vessel on the lake. Boating, skiing and other water activities are not permitted within the buoy line upstream of the dam wall.

Wuruma Dam Facts

- Built in 1968 on the Nogo River (a tributary of the Burnett River)
- Full storage level – 165,000 ML
- Provides water for farmland and townships downstream of the dam for approximately 160 km along the Burnett River.

Getting there

From Eidsvold (47 km)

Head north on the Burnett Highway (A3) for 19 km, then turn left onto Wuruma Dam Road (signs for Abercorn and Wuruma Dam).

Follow Wuruma Dam Road for 29 km, passing through Abercorn, until you reach Wuruma Dam.

Rubbish

Help us keep the recreational areas clean and tidy by using the rubbish bins provided. If they are full, please take your rubbish with you.

You may not dispose of redclaw, fish or seafood waste in these rubbish bins. Please take these with you when you leave.

From Monto (60 km)

Head south on the Burnett Highway (A3) for 13 km to Mulgildie, then turn right onto Hughs Street.

Follow Hughs Street for 2 km (becomes Abercorn Road), crossing Three Moon Creek, and turn left to stay on Abercorn Road.

Follow Abercorn Road for 22 km to Abercorn, then turn right onto Wuruma Dam Road.

Follow Wuruma Dam Road for 20 km until you reach Wuruma Dam.
